# Community Hub Consultation Event Tuesday 3 April 2012 Lambeth Accord 336 Brixton Road SW9 7AA

#### The event

Lambeth Accord and Lambeth Council are holding a consultation event on Community Hubs at Lambeth Accord, a building which already acts as a community hub for disabled people and their organisations. The event is open to anyone who is interested and would like to know more about community hubs. There will be speakers from Lambeth Council and voluntary organisations based at Lambeth Accord, together with a 'market place' of stalls from the wide variety of services based in the building.

#### Why you should attend

A number of consultation events are taking place but having one in a building that already represents a hub for disabled people is particularly appropriate. You will have the opportunity to find out more about Lambeth's Centre for Independent Living (CIL), a Co-operative Council pilot project, and in particular the One Stop Shop for Disabled People, which began operating from Lambeth Accord in March. You will get an opportunity to speak to the wide range of organisations at Lambeth Accord about the services and activities they provide and what it is that makes the building so special.

## Why it's happening

Community Hubs are buildings, where different groups can be based together, allowing them to save on costs, share ideas and plan together. These hubs could help to strengthen communities and encourage volunteering and local enterprise.
